

Any publication resulting from research work done in a laboratory which receives funds from the École normale supérieure de Lyon (ENSL) must be accessible in digital format in the **Publications de la Recherche Universitaire de l'ENS Lyon (PRUNEL)** repository.

Deposit policy

Objectives:

To fulfill the mission involving the distribution of scientific information incumbent on the ENSL and its researchers, thanks to the functionalities offered by an institutional Open Archive.

To build a reservoir receiving, regrouping, and listing the scientific production of the establishment.

It is important to note that documents deposited in the Open Archive are not submitted to peer review; Publication in a scientific journal remains necessary for purposes of evaluation.

Access and distribution:

PRUNEL; accessible through the ENS Lyon library website at <http://ens-lyon.fr/Bibli/prunel>

HAL (*Hyper Articles en Ligne*); documents deposited in the PRUNEL repository will supply the HAL multidisciplinary repository which is operated by the CCSD (*Centre pour la Communication Scientifique Directe*) and is destined to become the deposit platform shared by the whole of the French research community (<http://hal.ccsd.cnrs.fr/>).

Documents deposited in the PRUNEL repository may also, if the author wishes, be added to ArXiv and Pubmed

Important note: deposit in an Open Archive constitutes divulgence with regards to industrial property laws (patents) and may be considered as a violation of confidentiality obligations.

What to deposit:

Only those documents which do not infringe upon the rights of a third party. Depositors must, in particular, obtain confirmation from their editors of their right to place digital versions of their published work in an open archive.

Documents as yet unpublished and therefore not evaluated (pre-prints), articles in the process of validation, articles previously published and evaluated (post-prints), documents reporting the results released in a published patent application or a conference, theses, and bibliographical references.

Documents of a scientific level equal to that of publications submitted to peer review. Important: the author remains solely responsible for the content of documents not submitted to peer review—the ENS Lyon can in no way be held responsible.

Documents in their entirety or bibliographical references with summaries and source references. The deposit of files containing texts in their entirety is strongly encouraged.

Depositor obligations:

Depositors agree to respect the policies of the commercial editor of the text with regards to post-prints and to assure that the contract signed with the publisher authorizes the release of digital versions of the article. Depositors should bear in mind that authors depositing an article in an Open Archive remain free to deposit their texts elsewhere in the absence of obligations to the publisher or other copyright holders.

Depositors agree to respect the rules of "good conduct" regarding the respect of third parties (slander, libel), and regarding the scientific integrity of the documents he or she deposits.

Depositors agree to respect obligations of confidentiality concerning the results of research conducted under contract with the ENS Lyon.

Depositors certify that concerning Invited Lectures and communications for congresses and symposiums, the article deposited corresponds exactly to what was presented during the event.

Depositors agree to provide the repository with precise and reliable data which respects the nomenclature proposed for each type of document (article, chapter, thesis, etc.)

Depositors accept the completion, by the library, of the metadata describing the document, and to accept library control of the procedure, for the validation and acceptance of the deposit.

Depositors are warned that should an article be retracted by a scientific journal, the digital version of the document deposited in the ENSL repository shall be systematically removed.

User rights

The authors of the ENSL grant permission, on a non-exclusive basis, to the users of PRUNEL, HAL, and when applicable, ArXiv and PubMed, to consult, download, reproduce, and present the documents deposited by the authors, in part (without modification of the nature of the text) or in their entirety, by any adequate means, and to use without charge anywhere in the world for the length of time corresponding to the duration of the author's rights. This permission is granted for personal use, for educational purposes, for research, and for illustration, but excludes any and all commercial use, use for profit, and translation for which the permission of the author and the ENSL has not been obtained. Any and all use of all or a part of a document from the repository must include clear indication of the following information from the consultation page of the document: title, name of the author(s), name of the laboratory and its supporting agencies, and the repository from which the document comes.

Any use other than those stipulated above must be authorized by the author and the ENSL. Requests for authorization must include an exact description of the intended use of the document.
